

Marty is humbled and grateful for the incredible five year ride – The GhostLight Theatre was a dream in June 2017 as Paul Mow and Marty, sitting on her boat with drinks in hand, talked about a theatre they wanted to create. Five years later, it has become a thriving theatre and a creative home to people from all backgrounds, ages, and experiences.

Marty and her husband Don will soon move to their new home an hour north of Benton Harbor. Marty vacillates between the emotions of sadness for leaving the role of Executive Director, pride for what they have accomplished, and excitement for GhostLight's future. She says there are SO many people to

thank, the list would fill this entire program. So she simply says 'Thank You for the ride of a lifetime!'

Appointed by the Board to succeed Marty Hesse in April 2022, Ed brings a strong background in executive management and organizational development to The GhostLight Theatre.

Over a 30-year career in nonprofit management, Ed has served as the founding executive director, later President/CEO, of the Pritzker Military Library in Chicago and on the advancement and capital campaign staff at Norwich University in Vermont. A member of the American Theatre Critics Association, Ed has been reviewing theatre in Chicago for many years, is the recipient of a Chicago Midwest Regional Emmy Award and author of "Gorilla in the Room and Other Stories."

Kelly Collins Long Island, NY




Christian Roose Darien, CT

Based on Louisa May Alcott's 1868–69 semi-autobiographical two-volume novel, the musical version of Little Women focuses on the four March sisters—traditional Meg, wild, aspiring writer Jo, timid Beth and romantic Amy—and their beloved mother Marmee, at home in Concord, Massachusetts, while their father is away serving in the military. The GhostLight production is set during the Vietnam era and in the wake of the Women's Rights Movement, featuring a touching score and vignettes in which the women's lives unfold within the short stories Jo writes in her attic studio.



This play includes two acts in two distinct settings – Lewiston will be staged in our outdoor theatre space, and the second act Clarkston will be staged indoors in our black box theatre. During intermission, we are offering a catered dinner. In our theatre lobby, there will be a cash bar, and catered desserts.

LEWISTON: Alice and Connor sit by their roadside stand selling cheap fireworks while developers swallow the land around them. Promised a condo in the new development, their future is secure. Enter Marnie, Alice's long-lost granddaughter, proposing to buy the land to save her family's legacy. Marnie and Alice will become reacquainted with each other's deeply held secrets, uncertain pasts, and hopeful futures. Hunter, a 2014 MacArthur Fellowship recipient, explores the emotional frontiers of a family struggling to make a home in the vastness of the American landscape with affection, poignancy, and a profound sense of empathy.

CLARKSTON: Jake meets Chris when they are assigned to the same night shift at Costco in Clarkston, Washington. Chris has a hard life; his mom is a meth addict, and living in Clarkston has forced him down a dead-end road. He has promise, but he's "stuck." Jake went to a liberal arts school, is gay and out, but fled his Connecticut town when he was diagnosed with a fatal illness. Wanting to see the ocean, he came to Clarkston, but was sidetracked by his illness. He and Chris form an awkward bond: both are gay, but have led completely different lives. Can they learn to help each other?




